VOTER REGISTRATION DAYS

Voter registration will be Monday, April 3, 2023, and Monday, April 10, 2023, 7 AM-8 PM at Brentwood Town Hall, 4300 39th Place, Brentwood, MD 20722.

Anyone living in Brentwood who is 18 years or older can vote in the Brentwood Municipal election.

You do not need to be a US citizen to vote in this election

Voters must register by Tuesday, April 11, 2023.

If you do not register to vote by that date, you can register on election day, Monday, May 1, 2023.

In order to register to vote, you must have a document verifying you live in Brentwood (i.e., piece of mail, utility bill) and a photo ID.

Please note: your photo ID does not need to have your Brentwood address, solely your name and a picture. This could be a work badge, passport, government ID, etc.

Write-In Candidates

There are three candidates running for four seats for council. For this election, write-in candidates will be considered to fill the fourth seat. If you are campaigning as a write-in candidate, you must submit notification to electionjudges@brentwoodmd.gov. Please refer to [town charter](#) section 508.1 for more information.

El registro de votantes se llevará a cabo el lunes 3 de abril y el lunes 10 de abril de 7:00 am a 8:00 pm en Brentwood Town Hall, 4300 39th Place, Brentwood, MD 20722.

Cualquier persona mayor de 18 años que viva en Brentwood puede votar en las elecciones municipales de Brentwood.

No necesita ser ciudadano estadounidense para votar en esta elección.

Los votantes deben registrarse antes del martes 11 de abril. Si no se registra para votar antes de esa fecha, también puede registrarse el día de las elecciones.

Para registrarse para votar, debe tener un documento que verifique que vive en Brentwood (por ejemplo, una pieza de correo, una factura de servicios públicos) y una identificación con foto.

Tenga en cuenta: su identificación con foto no necesita tener su dirección de Brentwood, solo su nombre y una foto. Esto podría ser una credencial de trabajo, pasaporte, identificación del gobierno, etc.



He and his wife Toshira have been Brentwood residents since December 2013 and he was elected to his first term on the Council in 2019.

He currently is a Manager at an architectural software company called Graphisoft. Prior to that he was a project architect/manager at the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and before that he was a designer at Quinn Evans Architects, a full service architectural firm. His professional work includes institutional, commercial interiors, ambassadorial residences, and historic preservation projects. He's a former adjunct instructor for the Montgomery College Architecture Program and currently serves on the Advisory Committee as well as on the Board for the local chapter of the American Institute of Architects.

Marcus is the proud creator and lead instructor of the design apprenticeship program for teens called the Young Architects Workshop at the Brentwood Arts Exchange. In the past he's collaborated with local artists to develop a public arts project as a part of the IMPACT art initiative. He currently serves in multiple leadership roles in the community including his duties as Vice President of the Gateway Community Development Corporation Board of Directors as well as on the Governing Board of the Anacostia Trails Heritage Area, Inc. As Chair of the Legislative Committee for the Prince George's County Municipal Association, Marcus provides regional leadership on issues that impact the 27 municipalities across the County.

His community leadership currently focuses on affordable housing, school improvements, diversity, equitable development, and grassroots efforts toward artist led building ownership and management in the Gateway Arts District.

You may submit an affidavit on a form provided by the Town Clerk attesting to your identity and place of residence.

The affidavit must be executed by a person who:

- (1) Is registered to vote in the Town of Brentwood.
- (2) Is present with you to submit the affidavit; and
- (3) Has personal knowledge of your identity and actual residence.

Such affidavit shall be executed under the penalties of perjury.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR NON-UNITED STATES CITIZENS:

If you apply for naturalization, you will be asked whether you have ever registered or voted in a federal, state, or local election in the United States. The Town Clerk can provide a letter explaining that non-U.S. citizens who are residents of Brentwood may register and vote in Town of Brentwood municipal elections.
